

Fiber Exchange -- 2010

The annual NwRSA Fiber Exchange is an opportunity to have some fun by using your spinning and fiber arts skills to create something special for another NwRSA member from fiber that they provide! You submit an 8 ounce batch of ready-to-spin fiber, and in exchange you receive the fiber submission from one of the other exchange participants. You get one year to complete a project of your choice from the fiber you receive in exchange while your fiber spends the same year in another spinner's hands! Bring or send your completed project to the next year's Conference for non-judged display in the gallery so we can all appreciate your efforts

At the end of the Conference weekend we assign the ready-to-spin fibers for the next year's exchange. Also at the end of the weekend, the project you completed from last year goes back to the person who originally submitted that fiber, and the fiber you entered last year comes home to you as a completed project! This can be a great opportunity to forge social connections with your exchange partners, so please take the time to let your fiber-donor know you are their partner and have received their fiber to work with, and feel free to consult with them on ideas, preference, and sizes for your project.

To participate, bring your 8 ounces of ready-to-spin fiber with a \$3.00 entry fee and this completed form to the 2010 NwRSA Conference.
